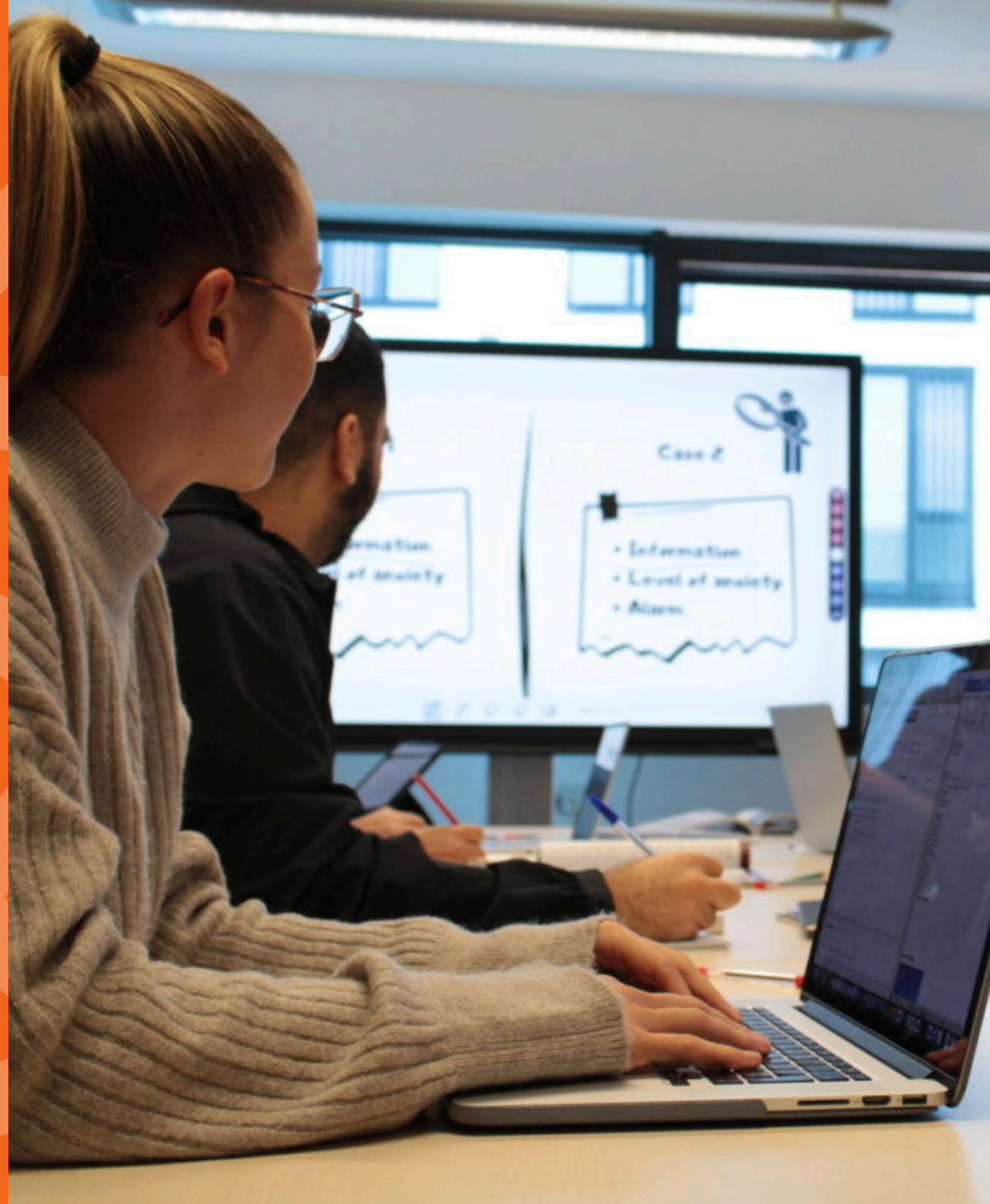

Atlantic can also organise **custom-designed courses for staff groups of more than 5.**

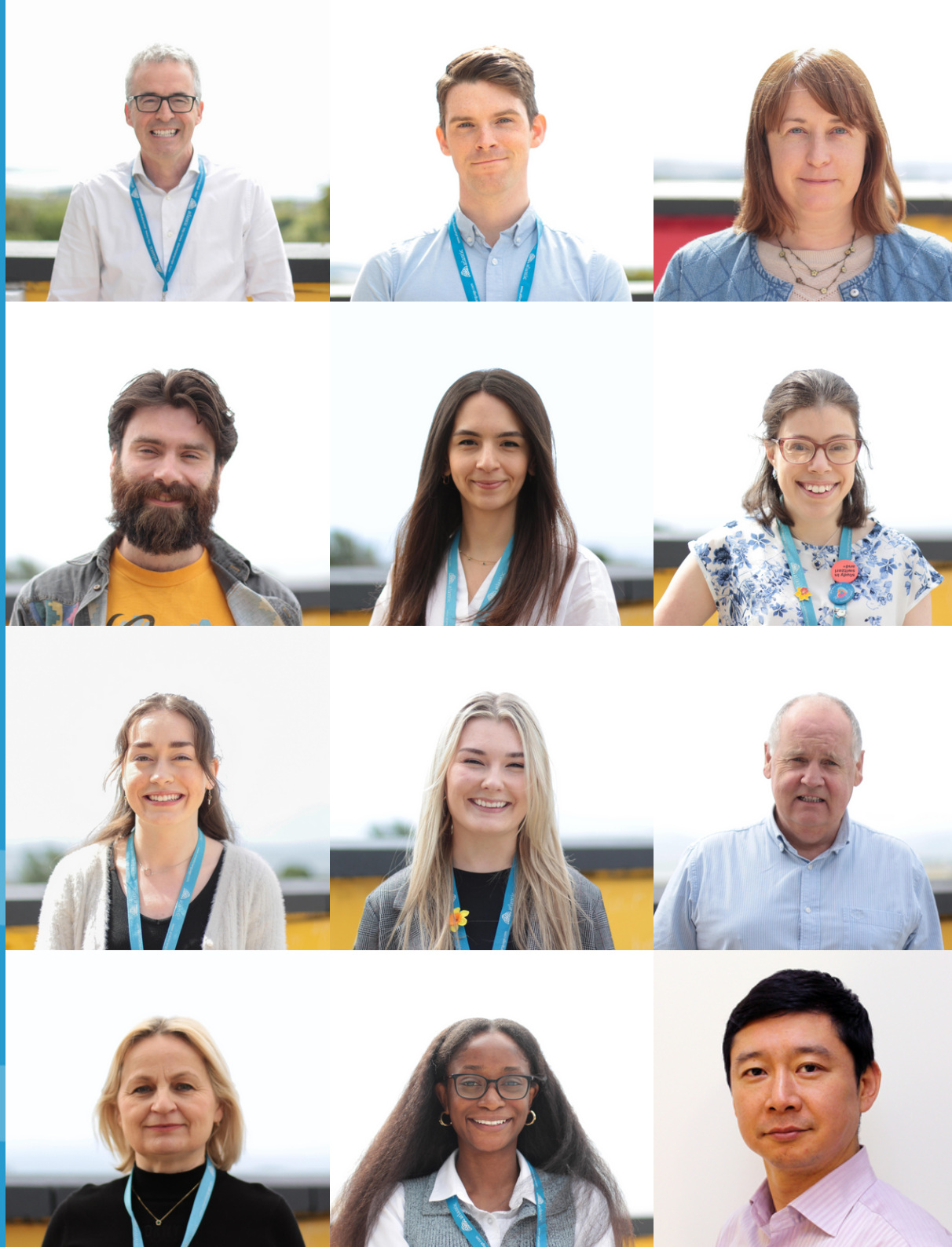
